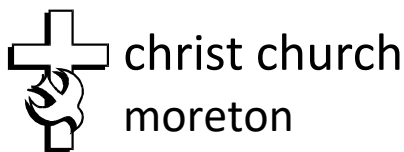

Our Week of Prayer, leading up to our APCM, was an important time for us, and it was good to see people meeting each day for prayer, as well as praying on their own. It was important, because we do need to keep our focus right – as we face challenges the solution doesn't lie in us, but in our great God. So do please go on praying!

There will be more opportunity for prayer as we join with the worldwide church between Ascension and Pentecost to pray "Thy Kingdom Come" Two years ago the Archbishops of Canterbury & York encouraged Christians to use that period to ask for the Holy Spirit to help them be witnesses to Jesus Christ and to pray for others to discover that living faith. By last year hundreds of thousands joined in. Having had our local week of prayer, it will be great to be part of something which is now global.

The church was born in prayer – not just private individual prayer, but prayer together, and on Sunday mornings this month we are going to look at some of the key times in the book of Acts when the church prayed together, with dramatic results. Growing in prayer does involve praying with others, which can sometimes be challenging.

As we have discovered in our week of prayer, sometimes when we are praying God seems to lay something on our hearts – it might be a picture, or a word. These might be part of his guiding us in response to our prayers, so we are recording these in a book which will be in the Prayer Room in the Parish Centre, and we will be praying through these as we seek to clarify our vision for the future.

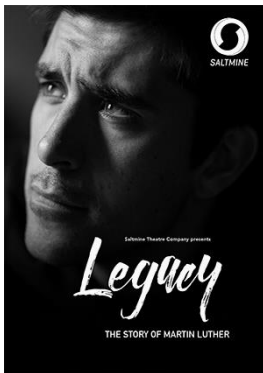
