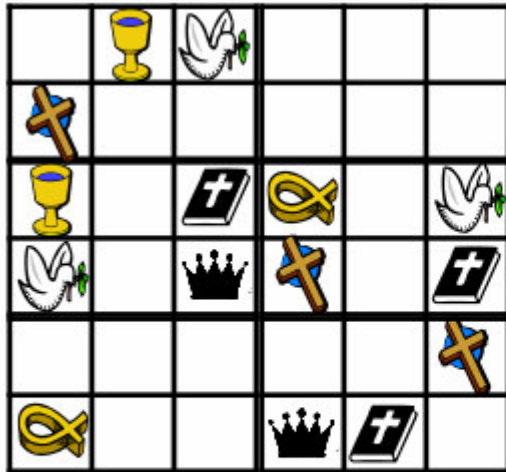

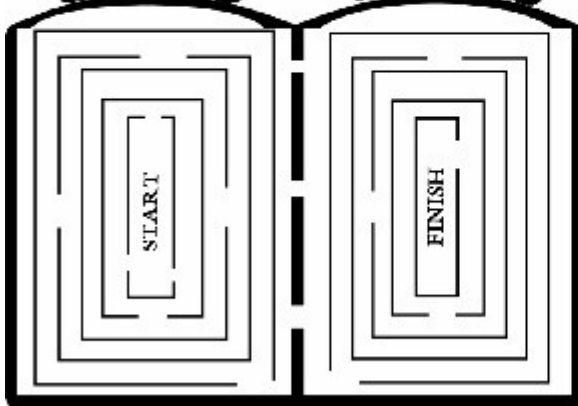


Bible cake.

Cream together 250g sugar, 250g Psalm 55:21, and 1tbsp 1 Samuel 14:25. Add 3 Jeremiah 17:11 one at a time, beating well. Add 250g each 1 Samuel 30:12 (2 ingredients), and 60g chopped Numbers 17:8 and beat again. Mix together 500g 1 Kings 4:22, 3tsp mixed 2 Chronicles 9:9, a pinch of Matthew 5:13 and 1tsp baking powder. Stir this into the mixture. Finally add 3tbsp 1 Corinthians 3:2. Bake at Gas mark 3, 325F, 170C for about 1½ hours. Then ENJOY!

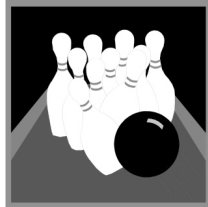

Dear Friends at Christ Church

'Remember, remember'

This month we have 2 big occasions which focus on remembering. There's bonfire night – 'remember, remember, the fifth of November' and then Remembrance Sunday. Both those events have to do with recalling what has happened in the past, but the Bible urges us as Christians to remember not only the past, but also the present and the future!

We need to **remember what we were**. Paul uses graphic language in his letter to the Ephesians to describe the state of all of us before we became Christians, by saying that we were 'without hope and without God in the world.' (Ephesians 2:12) If we are to appreciate what God has done for us, we need to remember the state we were in without him.

We also need to **remember what we are**. In the same passage Paul writes that God has 'made us alive in Christ even when we were dead in transgressions (Ephesians 2:5). Whatever is going on in the world around is, however much we may have to struggle, God is on our side. No matter how others look at us, no matter what we think about ourselves, the truth that defines our lives is that we are 'alive in Christ.'

And the Bible also encourages us to **remember what we will be**. Sometimes we get bogged down in life here and now, and lose sight of the future that God has planned for his people. But Paul reminds us that 'No eye has seen, no ear has heard, no mind has conceived what God has prepared for those who love him.' (1 Corinthians 2:9)

It is as we remember God's wonderful goodness to us, in forgiving our past, and giving us a future, that we will be encouraged to go on living for him now. So – whatever else you might forget – remember your past, present and future!
