### Hark the glad sound, the Saviour comes

Once again it is Advent – a time for preparing to celebrate the coming of Jesus to Bethlehem around 2000 years ago, and to look forward to his coming again. It is one of the great times in the Christian year!

But the society around us will spend the coming few weeks throwing itself into preparing for a very different festival. Despite the big cuts in our economy, money will be spent, houses will be decorated, cards sent, food and drink bought, parties thrown. And all to celebrate ... nothing. The modern 'Xmas' is actually an appropriate name for these secular festivities – 'X' often stands for an unknown, and most people will be celebrating without having any reason.

**We don't celebrate Xmas, we celebrate Christmas.** Or at least we should. But living in an Xmas society, we can all too easily get swept along by the crowd, and end up keeping the next month as the season of Advert, rather than Advent. When we do that, we miss out on the wonder and the joy that are at the heart of Christmas, and we miss out on the hope that is ours as we look forward to the return of our Lord Jesus Christ, who *'was sacrificed once to take away the sins of many people; and he will appear a second time, not to bear sin, but to bring salvation to those who are waiting for him.'* (Hebrews 9:28)

So how are you going to spend the next few weeks? As the season of Advent, or of Advert? Joyfully looking forward to Jesus' return, or too busy to give him more than a passing thought? Will you spend the time getting ready for Xmas, doing the same as the people around you? Or by preparing to celebrate Christmas? And then, will you celebrate Xmas this year, by finally crashing out after all the hectic preparations? Or will you celebrate Christmas, by joining with others at Christ Church to welcome the new born King?
