This is week 8 of our E100 Bible Reading challenge. We have seen how God faithfully brought his people into the Promised Land, despite all their failures, and how at last David became king. David conquered Jerusalem, and it became not only his capital, but also the place where God's people gathered to worship him.

Everything seemed perfect – but it didn't last. Even David, the greatest of kings, fell into sin, and after him God's people once again went astray. They worshipped false gods, they tolerated immorality and exploitation, yet despite the warnings of the prophets, they refused to turn back to the Lord. And so finally God sent them into exile, away from the Land he had promised them. But still God hadn't abandoned his plan that through a descendent of Abraham, a descendent of David, he would bring blessing to his broken world.
