


E100 BIBLE READINGS This week 19 of our E100 Bible Reading Challenge.

We continue this week with the New Testament letters – written by the apostles to help Christians and churches understand what to believe and how to live. Although they were written long ago, we still need these today, as we still live as God's people in a non-Christian society. This week we read a bit more from the apostle Paul – especially his famous description of love in 1 Corinthians 13. We also learn from the apostles Peter, James and John what it means to live the Christian life. We are coming towards the end of E100 (though I'm sure I'm not the only one to have a bit of ground to make up!)
