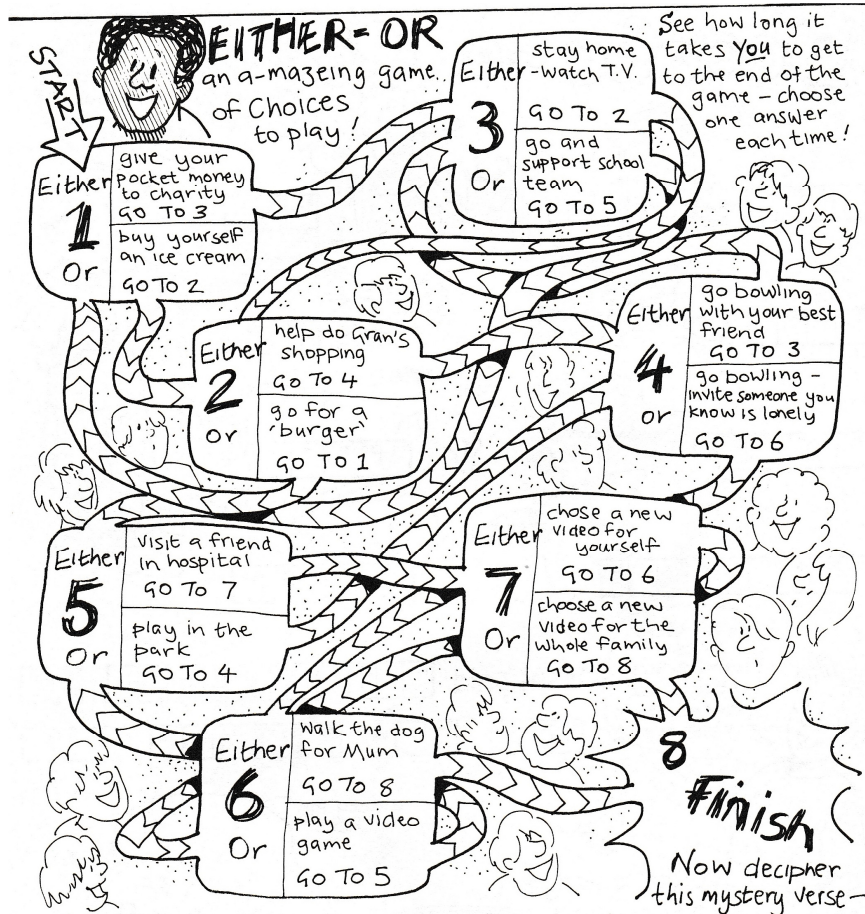

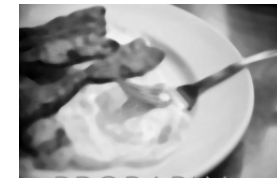
SUNDAY 18th JANUARY
